All of Me

Eating Disorders

focuses on the lives of women, girls and some boys, who are caught in the downward spiral of eating disorders and their struggle to regain a sense of self-compassion and healing. The film explores body image, a lack of connection with one's physical and emotional being and the need to delve deep to find the triggers for this disease.



The Hungry Heart

Opiate Addiction

provides an intimate look at the often hidden world of prescription drug addiction through the world of Pediatrician Fred Holmes, who works with patients struggling with this disease. The film shines a light on the healing power of conversation and the need for connection that many of these young addicts yearn for but do not have in their lives.



Ask Us Who We Are

Foster Care

focuses on the challenges and extraordinary lives of youth in foster care. The film is a reflection on loss and the search for belonging and finding family. It reveals the tremendous strength and perseverance that grows out of the determination to survive and thrive. The film breaks open stereotypes and gives voice to those who are often not heard.



Here Today

Heroin Addiction

is about heroin and the effects of addiction on loved ones. The film explores stories of people from diverse backgrounds and gains insights from addicts, families, and treatment professionals, illustrating the human struggle of people as they valiantly battle their addiction, support their loved ones, and try to move forward with their lives.



Shout It Out

Teenagers

tells the story of a group of teenagers in high school experiencing academic pressure, friction with peers, race, sexuality, teen pregnancy, body image, self-harm, class issues, relationships with parents, fitting in, finding one's self, fear of the future, nostalgia, friendship, and first love. The Voices Project

Teenagers

is a theater musical inspired by the stories of 1000 teenagers and incorporating songs composed by 20 students, the show is raw, real, humorous and shows the struggles, hopes and dreams of teenagers from many walks of life, including youth struggling with peer pressure, body image, depression, love, friends and family.



After The Fog

Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder & Veterans

chronicles the experiences of 11 U.S. combat veterans, who tell highly personal stories of military recruitment, training, combat, and reintegration into civilian life. They share insights that question the nature and impact of war and the way humans cope with intense emotional, psychological, and physical changes they experience from combat.



Approaching The Elephant

Education

dives head first into the inaugural year of the Teddy McArdle Free School, where all classes are voluntary and rules are determined by vote – adults and children have an equal say. An indelible cast of outspoken young personalities form relationships, explore their surroundings and intensely debate rule violations, until it all comes to a head.
